## **Health and Safety Checklist**

The weekly safety inspection needs to cover all aspects of the property: the cabins, dining hall, staff quarters, craft cabin, medic's cabin, boat house, maintenance shed, and outside activity areas. ☐ Are the walking paths free of potential tripping hazards? ☐ Are camp rules and emergency procedures prominently posted in a high-traffic area such as the Mess Hall? ☐ Is good housekeeping being maintained in all storage areas? ☐ Are any dangerous protrusions, such as nails, slivers, etc., eliminated? ☐ Are the rugs and floors cleaned frequently? Are the rugs free of tears or rips that could cause trips? ☐ Is the storage shed and the laundry room kept clean and locked? ☐ Are repairs performed promptly? ☐ Are all outdoor night lights in working order? ☐ Are all exit areas free of obstructions? Do all buildings have working smoke detectors? Have the fire extinguishers been updated and checked monthly by the staff? ☐ Is the kitchen free of grease accumulation? ☐ Are the refrigerator and freezer temperatures monitored? ☐ Is garbage removed frequently from buildings and stored securely? ☐ Are the first aid kits fully stocked? Is all safety equipment present in the boat house including whistles, bailers, life jackets. etc.? ☐ Is the boat house kept clean? ☐ Is the swim area clear of clutter and debris? ☐ Are all cabins clean and in good repair? Are the bathrooms and showers kept clean and in working order? ☐ Are all emergency telephone numbers posted by the phones? ☐ Is the Medic's cabin kept locked with all medication inside? ☐ Are all staff and camper personnel records kept in a locked location? ☐ Is the Craft Cabin kept clean? ☐ Is the archery equipment and all hatchets and lighters kept locked in the back room of the Craft Cabin? ☐ Is the play equipment in good condition?
